Pre-K Camp Field Trip Days

Field Trip days will be a little different than other days at camp. On our field trip days, campers must be dropped off <u>no later than 8:15 AM</u>. Parents must also leave a car seat or booster seat for each child (if they do not desire to use the YMCA's provided low-back booster seats) so we can safely transport them to and from our destination. There <u>may</u> be a \$1.00-\$5.00 fee (depending on the trip) that must be paid in cash in advance. As always, please do not send your child with any extra spending money as we will not be purchasing anything extra on our trips. We will return to the YMCA before 12:30 PM. We ask that your child wears his/her tie-dyed camp shirt on all field trip days to more easily identify our group. All field trip information will be covered in the weekly newsletter the week prior to the trip.

COVID-19 & Other Health Guidelines

SNACKS: A daily snack will be provided. Some will be pre-packaged, but others will not. We will sanitize before serving the snack and wear gloves if the snack is not prepackaged.

MASKS: Masks are recommended for Camp Osage Pre-K Camp, but they are <u>NOT</u> required. Wearing a mask is up to your discretion as the parent. We will be outside and social-distance when possible, but not at all times. Some field trips will require that a mask be worn. That will be fully communicated ahead of time in the weekly newsletter.

ILLNESSES: Children should not be sent to camp if they have <u>any</u> of the following symptoms 24 hours prior to arrival. Children must be symptom free <u>without</u> medication for 24 hours before returning to camp. A child who is unable to participate in activities (due to an injury) should not be sent to camp.

- <u>FEVER</u>: if over 100 degrees or accompanied by other symptoms such as vomiting, diarrhea, etc.
- <u>RESPIRATORY PROBLEMS</u>: severe congestion, coughing or unexplained wheezing
- LOSS OF SMELL/TASTE: if a new or sudden change has occurred
- <u>VOMITING AND/OR DIARRHEA</u>: which occurs more than once or is accompanied by other flu-like symptoms
- <u>RASH</u>: if the cause of the rash is unknown, if the rash is not being treated, or if rash is known to be contagious
- <u>CHICKEN POX</u>: or other communicative diseases.
- <u>HEAD LICE</u>: must have approval from Health Department (free of charge) if child has missed camp due to head lice. Random checks may be done at the discretion of Camp Staff for your child's safety.

If a child becomes ill at camp, the camp staff will call the parent of the child based on contact information listed on the registration sheet and/or health history form. A child who is vomiting will not be kept at camp for any reason.
